Standard T/20 Playing Conditions will apply with the following Competition Rules.

1. Teams shall consist of 12 players and a member of staff and/or coach. List of 11 players must be submitted at least 15 minutes before start of each match to the referee and no changes thereafter.
2. There will be ZC appointed scorers for each match. Their results will be taken for all scores and statistics. However each team must supply a reserve player to help with identification of players and may also score if required by the team, but it is not vital. These scorers have the right to prompt the umpire to ensure a 6 ball over is completed correctly. The umpire must comply with this instruction.
3. Each bowler may bowl a maximum of four overs.
4. NB : Law 24.1 shall be replaced by the following:
ALL MODES OF NO BALL. The delivery following a no ball called shall be a free hit for whichever batsman is facing it. If the delivery for the free hit is not a legitimate delivery then the next delivery will become a free hit as well. For any free hit the striker can be dismissed ONLY under the circumstances that apply for a no ball, even if the delivery for the free hit is called wide ball.
5. Only two (2) fielders allowed outside the 30 yard circle for the first six overs. Thereafter no more than five fielders are allowed outside the 30 yard circle. No more than five fielders are allowed on the leg side.
6. The 20 overs per innings must be bowled within 75 minutes. If a team is clearly wasting time at any point, the umpire must warn the side that they need to make an effort to be quicker at the bowling charge or in the field or both if the team is still over the time allowed they shall be reported to the match referee. A team will lose one point only if they have failed to heed the warnings at the discretion of the match referee. The teams are to change over in the five minutes time period provided.
7. Teams will be awarded four (4) points for a win, two (2) points for a tie and nil (0) for a loss.
8. One bonus point will be awarded to any team that achieves victory with a run-rate 1.25 times that of the opposition. When batting second the target needs to be reached by the end of the 16th over. When bowling second you need to restrict the opposition to a total that is less than your total divided by 1.25%.
9. The Festival will NOW be divided into 2 stages as follows:-
Stage 1: **The Pool matches**. The positions within each Pool will be decided by most points as per normal.
Stage 2:
 - i. The Trophy Section play-off matches will be played between the top two teams in each pool. The team that finishes top in each pool will play the two teams that finished second in the other two pools.
 - ii. The Plate Section play-off matches will be played between the bottom two teams in each pool. The team that finishes third in each pool will play the two teams that finished fourth in the other two pools.
10. All bonus points earned in the pool matches will be carried forward into the play-offs.
11. **Net run rate** is calculated by subtracting the run rate achieved by a team's opponents in all matches from the run rate achieved by that team in all matches. A teams' run rate will be calculated by reference to the runs scored in an innings divided by the number of overs faced. Where a side is all out, the number of overs to be used is the maximum number of overs that side was otherwise eligible to face. Where matches are shortened and targets revised through the Duckworth/Lewis system, run rate is NOT applicable
12. In the event that teams are tied on points at the end of the preliminary round and the end of the play-offs, teams going through to the play offs and the finals will be decided as follows:-
 - iii. The team with the most number of wins.
 - iv. If still equal, the team with the most number of wins over the other team(s) who are equal on points and have the same number of wins.
 - v. If still equal, the team with the highest number of bonus points.
 - vi. If still equal, the team with the highest net run rate throughout the series.
 - vii. Or the team with the best over rate throughout the series.
13. If the final is a tie the winner will be decided by an "eliminator" over.
14. The Duckworth-Lewis method of re-calculating the target score will be used in an interrupted match.
15. The match referee's decision will be final. Mr Langton Rusire will be appointed as Match Referee.
16. **At their discretion the organisers reserve the right to select which teams are invited to participate in this festival.**
17. **Other points for Umpires to please check and consider:-**
 - i. There are prizes given for the following:-
 - a) Best Bowler
 - b) Best Batsman
 - c) Best All Rounder

Statistics will determine all of these. BUT your contributions are also most valuable and very welcome. If you could make notes on your score card it would be appreciated. Thank you.

- ii. The scorers appointed will record the starting and finishing times as well as any breaks in play as signalled by the umpires.
- iii. Please put the result (although it is stating the obvious). It does help and sign your name etc.
- iv. Make sure you have a spare ball and please avoid time delays – use it if the ball is not recovered immediately.
- v. Spare stumps and bails should be at the scorer's tent to also avoid a delay if these are broken.
- vi. Please ensure time limits are obeyed and teams make every effort to change overs quickly and generally don't waste time.
- vii. Please return the score cards immediately after the match to Mini Macdonald.
- viii. Please take note of rules 2 and 4.
